35 **SUMMARY**

36 This amendment reestablishes the annual license fee for asbestos abatement
37 contractors and asbestos abatement consultants to be the same for each year instead of a
38 different amount for the first annual license, the 2nd annual license and the 3rd annual
39 license as proposed by Committee Amendment "A."

1 This amendment also decreases the annual fee as proposed in the bill for an asbestos
2 abatement contractor from \$1,000 to \$650, an asbestos worker from \$75 to \$50, an
3 asbestos consultant from \$1,000 to \$650, an asbestos analytical laboratory from \$500 to
4 \$400 and other categories of asbestos professionals from \$150 to \$100. The amendment
5 also decreases certain notification fees by \$100.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment will reduce the proposed increase in the Department of Environmental Protection's processing and certification fees related to asbestos abatement by the amounts shown above. As amended, it is anticipated that the new fee structure effective September 1, 2009 will increase Other Special Revenue Funds revenue by \$75,000 in FY 2009-10 and \$100,000 in subsequent years.
