COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 518, L.D. 1434, Bill, "An Act Regarding Asbestos Abatement Work"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 5-A by striking out all of Table II (page 4, lines 30 to 37, page 5, lines 1 to 42 and page 6, lines 1 to 37 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

11 consultants to \$250 for the first annual license, \$625 for the 2nd annual license and  
12 \$1,000 for the 3rd and each subsequent annual license. The amendment also adds an  
13 appropriations and allocations section.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill will increase the Department of Environmental Protection's processing and certification fees related to asbestos abatement. It is anticipated that the new fee structure, effective September 1, 2009, will increase Other Special Revenue Funds revenue by \$100,000 in FY 2009-10 and \$144,000 in FY 2010-11. The bill includes increased allocations to the department to allow use of the increased fee revenue to cover asbestos abatement expenditures which do not include hiring additional staff.
