#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill will increase the Department of Environmental Protection's processing and certification fees related to asbestos abatement. It is anticipated that the new fee structure, effective September 1, 2009, will increase Other Special Revenue Funds revenue by \$100,000 in FY 2009-10 and \$144,000 in FY 2010-11. The bill includes increased allocations to the department to allow use of the increased fee revenue to cover asbestos abatement expenditures which do not include hiring additional staff.
