SUMMARY

2	This bill provides for the issuance of a free day use pass to state parks and historic
3	sites to a veteran who is a resident of this State and who received an honorable discharge
4	or general discharge under honorable conditions. It removes the requirement that a
5	veteran must have served for a minimum of 3 continuous months outside the United
6	States between October 1, 2001 and January 1, 2015 either on an operational mission for
7	which members of the reserve were ordered to active duty or during a period of war
8	declared by the United States Congress or a period of national emergency declared by the
9	President of the United States or Congress. It also removes language that repeals on June
10	30, 2015 the sections of the law that provide day use passes to veterans.
