
SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 598,  
L.D. 1561, Bill, "An Act To Regulate the Use of Traffic Surveillance Cameras"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in §2117-A in subsection 3 in paragraph C in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 1 and 2 in amendment) by striking out the following: "a reasonable articulable suspicion, or records from the National Crime Information Center database" and inserting the following: 'specific and articulable facts of a concern for safety, wrongdoing or a criminal investigation or pursuant to a civil order or records from the National Crime Information Center database or an official published law enforcement bulletin'

SUMMARY

This amendment makes specific the factors that must exist when a law enforcement agency is using an automated license plate recognition system.
