14 15	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:
16	'Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §185, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:
17 18 19 20 21	<u>1-A.</u> Immunity from civil and criminal liability for supervising physician. Subsection 1 applies to the supervising physician of a physician assistant under Title 32, section 2594-B or 3270-B when the physician assistant is on active state service in the performance of the physician assistant's duty even when the supervising physician is not on active state service.'
22	SUMMARY
23	This amendment is the majority report of the committee.
24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31	This amendment replaces the bill, but retains the intent to immunize and provide for the defense of the physician who supervises a physician assistant who is on active state service in the performance of the physician assistant's duties. Current law applies to the supervising physician only if the supervising physician is on active state service. This amendment provides the same protection when the supervising physician is not on active state service, but the physician assistant is on active state service in the performance of the physician assistant's duty. This amendment applies to osteopathic and allopathic physicians who are the supervising physician of physician assistants.
