1 A. Intentionally or knowingly poison, defile or in any way corrupt the water of any 2 well, spring, brook, lake, pond, river or reservoir used for domestic drinking 3 purposes; 4 B. Knowingly corrupt the sources of any public water supply, or the tributaries of those sources of supply, in a manner that affects the purity of the water supplied; 5 6 C. Knowingly defile waters identified in paragraphs A and B in any manner, whether 7 the water is frozen or not; or 8 D. Put a carcass of any dead animal or other offensive material in waters identified in 9 paragraphs A and B or on the ice of those waters. A person may place the carcass of 10 a dead animal on the ice of a brook, great pond or river for purposes of coyote hunting as long as the carcass is removed before the ice supporting that carcass is 11 12 gone. This paragraph does not authorize a person to enter the property owned by 13 another person without the permission of the property owner. 14 2. Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a Class A crime. 15 Sec. 5. Open water fishing season. Except as otherwise provided in a rule 16 adopted by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife that is specific to a particular 17 body of water in the State, the open water fishing season for 2010 begins on the effective 18 date of this Act. The rules adopted by the department governing open water fishing and 19 ice fishing for the 2008-2009 season remain in effect until April 1, 2010. This section is 20 repealed April 1, 2010. ' 21 Amend the bill by adding before the summary the following: 22 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 23 legislation takes effect when approved.' 24 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or 25 section number to read consecutively. 26 **SUMMARY** 27 This amendment amends the law prohibiting the corruption of drinking water by 28 clarifying that a hunter may place a carcass on the ice for purposes of covote hunting. 29 The amendment also exempts coyotes from the waste of game prohibition. 30 The amendment specifies that, except as otherwise provided in a rule adopted by the 31 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife that is specific to a particular body of water 32 in the State, the open water fishing season for 2010 begins on the effective date of the 33 bill.
