SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 615, L.D. 1650, Bill, "An Act To Amend
Certain Provisions of Fish and Wildlife Laws"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §11302, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and
affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:

1. Limit on number of dogs. A person may not, while either hunting alone or
hunting with other persons, use more than ~~4~~ 6 dogs at any one time to hunt bear.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment increases from 4 to 6 the number of dogs a person may use at any
one time to hunt bear.
