1 2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3 4 5 6	Whereas, Public Law 2009, chapter 213, Part QQQ directed the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs to continue the effort of streamlining State Government begun in 2007 and achieve a targeted spending reduction of at least \$30,000,000 in the 2010-2011 biennium; and
7 8	Whereas, the committee is authorized to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature to implement its recommendations; and
9 10 11	Whereas, it is necessary for this legislation to take effect sooner than the 90 days after adjournment of the Second Regular Session in order to achieve the recommended savings; and
12 13 14 15	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the prese vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

With the assistance of the Secretary of State, the Attorney General shall prepare a brief explanatory statement that must fairly describe the intent and content and what a "yes" vote favors and a "no" vote opposes for each constitutional resolution or statewide referendum that may be presented to the people and that must include any information prepared by the Treasurer of State under Title 5, section 152. The explanatory statement may not include comments of proponents or opponents as provided by section 354. In addition to the explanatory statement, the Office of Fiscal and Program Review shall prepare an estimate of the fiscal impact of each constitutional resolution or statewide referendum on state revenues, appropriations and allocations within 10 business days after the receipt of the application and full text of the proposed law by the Secretary of State. The fiscal impact estimate must summarize the aggregate impact that the constitutional resolution or referendum will have on the General Fund, the Highway Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds and the amounts distributed by the State to local units of government. The Secretary of State shall publish the explanatory statement and the fiscal estimate in each daily newspaper of the State, not more than 10 and not less than 7 days prior to the voting. This information may be published in the English language in a foreign language newspaper.

This Part authorizes the Commissioner of Conservation to install fee collection 2 containers at unstaffed entrances of certain state parks and historic sites and establish fees 3 that will generate additional undedicated revenue to the General Fund of \$17,000 in fiscal year 2009-10 and \$132,000 annually beginning in fiscal year 2010-11. 5 PART G 6 This Part requires that all unspent Personal Services appropriations in executive 7 branch agencies lapse to the Salary Plan program, General Fund account in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. This Part also lapses \$500,000 in 8 9 fiscal year 2009-10 and \$468,985 in fiscal year 2010-11 to the General Fund to recognize 10 the additional transfers to the Salary Plan as General Fund savings. PART H 11 .12 This Part limits slot machine revenue credited to the Fund for a Healthy Maine to \$4,500,000 annually. 13 PART I 14 This Part repeals a provision of law that allows General Fund balances in the State 15 16 Supplement to Federal Supplemental Security program within the Department of Health and Human Services to carry forward from one fiscal year to the next. It also prohibits 17 the transfer by financial order of State Supplement to Federal Supplemental Security 18 19 program funds. 20 PART J 21 This Part establishes an annual limit of \$1,700,000 on the amount of General Fund appropriations the Driver Education and Evaluation Programs may receive. 22 23 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED
