The department may remove from sale a beverage that is old or distributed in the State by an initiator of deposit who is not in compliance with the eporting and payment requirements established in this section if the department is otified by the State Tax Assessor of that noncompliance. The department shall allow the ale of the beverage to resume upon notification by the State Tax Assessor that all elinquent reports have been submitted and all payments are current.

25 26 27 28	W	This bill amends the laws relating to beverage containers to provide that the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources may remove beverages from sale when the initiator of deposit is not in compliance with reporting and payment equirements.
