COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 12, L.D. 20, Bill, "An Act Designating March 29th Vietnam Veterans Day"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. Fiftieth anniversary program. The Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management shall work with the Governor's office and the United States Department of Defense to develop a program to commemorate the contribution of Maine veterans in the Vietnam War in conjunction with the 10-year program being developed by the Federal Government to recognize the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War.'

SUMMARY

This amendment directs the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management to work with the Governor's office and the United States Department of Defense to develop a program to commemorate the contribution of Maine veterans in the Vietnam War in conjunction with the 10-year federal program being developed to recognize the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War.
