HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 71,
L.D. 83, Bill, "An Act To Legalize the Sale, Possession and Use of Fireworks"

Amend the amendment in section 5 in §223-A in subsection 8 by striking out all of
paragraph B (page 4, lines 26 to 28 in amendment) and inserting the following:

'B. A person may use consumer fireworks only:

(1) On that person's property if the use of consumer fireworks on that property
occurs at least 1/4 mile from all building structures or if the consumer fireworks
are fired from the shore of a lake or other large body of water and directed in
such manner that the falling residue from the deflagration will fall into that lake
or body of water;

(2) On the property of a person who has consented to the use of consumer
fireworks if the use of consumer fireworks on that property occurs at least 1/4
mile from all building structures or if the consumer fireworks are fired from the
shore of a lake or other large body of water and directed in such manner that the
falling residue from the deflagration will fall into that lake or body of water; or

(3) Under direct supervision of a local fire department.'

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the restrictions concerning the use of consumer fireworks to
allow use of consumer fireworks on a user's property or the property of a consenting
person if the use occurs at least 1/4 mile from all building structures or the fireworks are
fired from the shore of a lake or other large body of water and directed in such manner
that the falling residue from the deflagration falls into the body of water or to allow use
under direct supervision of a local fire department.
