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'Mandate preamble. This measure requires one or more local units of government  
14 to expand or modify activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local  
15 revenues but does not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures. Pursuant to  
16 the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21, 2/3 of all of the members elected to  
17 each House have determined it necessary to enact this measure.'

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

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## Fiscal Note

State Mandate - Exempted

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment adds a Mandate Preamble. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble, the two-thirds vote of all members elected to each House exempts the state from the constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local costs.
