An Act To Exempt Nonprofit Organizations from the Laws Governing Serving Alcohol near a Church

I	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §701, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2005, c. 269, §1, is further amended to read:
4 5 6 7 8	1. Location within 300 feet of churches and schools. Except as provided in paragraphs B and, C and D, the bureau may not issue a new license for the sale of liquor to be consumed on the premises to new premises within 300 feet of a public or private school, school dormitory, church, chapel or parish house in existence as such at the time the application for the new license is made.
9 10 11	B. The bureau may after holding a public hearing near the proposed location issue licenses to premises that are either in or within 300 feet of a church, chapel, parish house or postsecondary school.
12 13	C. The restriction in this subsection does not apply if a public or private school, school dormitory, church, chapel or parish house:
14 15 16 17 18	(1) Locates in a commercial zone that includes restaurants or bars as permitted uses and that had been established pursuant to a zoning ordinance as defined in Title 30-A, section 4301, subsection 15-A prior to the public or private school, school dormitory, church, chapel or parish house locating in the commercial zone; or
19 20	(2) Is located in a downtown as defined in Title 30-A, section 4301, subsection 5-A.
21 22	D. The restriction in this subsection relating to a church, chapel or parish house does not apply to an applicant or licensee that is a nonprofit organization.
23	SUMMARY
24 25 26	This bill exempts a nonprofit organization from the prohibition against licensing premises that are within 300 feet of a church, chapel or parish house for the sale of liquor to be consumed on the premises.
