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#### SUMMARY

14 This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It replaces the bill with a 15 resolve that requires that the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Board 16 of Dental Examiners establish a 2-year pilot project to allow a licensed independent 17 practice dental hygienist to expose and process radiographs under protocols developed by the Board of Dental Examiners within areas of the State that have been designated by the 18 19 United States Department of Health and Human Services as dental health professional 20 shortage areas. The rules for the pilot project must require that the independent practice dental hygienist have an agreement in writing to have a licensed dentist available to 21 interpret all dental radiographs within 21 days from the date a radiograph is taken and for 22 the dentist to sign a radiographic review and findings form. It requires the Board of 23 24 Dental Examiners to provide a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 25 having jurisdiction over economic development matters regarding the status of the pilot 26 project and its ability to improve access to dental health services in federally designated 27 dental health professional shortage areas and recommendations for continuance, discontinuance or modification of the pilot project. It also terminates the project March 28 29 15, 2014. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The bill includes Other Special Revenue Funds allocations to the Board of Dental Examiners, affiliated with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, of \$3,700 in fiscal year 2011-12 and \$1,200 in fiscal year 2012-13 for the costs associated with establishing and administering the 2-year pilot project. The board has sufficient funds available within its existing resources to support the costs of this legislation. Additional registration revenue collected by the Department of Health and Human Services is expected to be minor
