In addition, up to \$25,000 may be deposited in the fund from the revenues generated by moose hunting application and permit fees to carry out the department's documented moose research. The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and accounts.

7. Subpermittees. An applicant for a moose permit may indicate on the application
filed pursuant to subsection 6 the name of a subpermittee-designate and the name of an
alternate subpermittee-designate. If the applicant is issued a moose permit under
subsection 9 and upon application to the commissioner, the permittee may change that
person's subpermittee-designate or alternate subpermittee-designate until 30 days prior to
the start of the moose hunting season for which the permit was issued. Thirty days prior
to the start of the applicable moose hunting season, the subpermittee-designate becomes a
subpermittee and the. The permittee may authorize the subpermittee to participate in the
moose hunt with the permittee. The permittee may authorize the alternate
subpermittee-designate to participate in the hunt in place of the subpermittee-designate if
the permittee notifies the department of the authorization at least 5 business days prior to
the first day of the moose season, in which case the alternate subpermittee-designate
becomes the subpermittee. The permittee may choose not to authorize a subpermittee to
participate in the hunt.

- D. Ten points each year after the 15th year.
 - Each point entitles an applicant to one chance in the public chance drawing. A person's accumulated points are eliminated and that person begins to accumulate points anew if in any year that person is selected to receive a moose hunting permit or if that person fails to purchase a new chance in any 2 consecutive years.

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SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report and replaces the bill. It does the following:

- 1. It limits the number of chances a resident may purchase for the moose hunting permit lottery to one and reduces the number of moose hunting permit lottery chances contained in a super pack license from 6 to one;
- 2. It modifies the point system for the moose hunting permit lottery to improve a person's chances in the lottery the longer that person has stayed in the lottery and has not received a moose hunting permit;
- 3. As does the bill, it changes the amount of time a moose hunting permit holder must wait to be eligible for another moose hunting permit from 2 years to 3 years;
- 4. It provides that a person that is ineligible to obtain a moose hunting permit because that person has received a permit within the last 2 years may continue to buy additional chances for the moose hunting permit lottery over that period of ineligibility for the corresponding application fee;
- 5. It allows a person to indicate on the moose hunting permit application that that person does not want to receive a moose permit for that year but wants to continue to accrue chances in the moose hunting permit lottery;
- 6. It establishes the Moose Research and Management Fund and moves a provision of existing law regarding funding for moose research to the section of law that establishes the fund;
- 7. It increases the moose hunting permit fee for nonresidents and aliens from \$484 to \$585 and directs that \$100 from each of these permits be deposited in the Moose Research and Management Fund;
- 8. It allows an applicant for a moose hunting permit to change that person's subpermittee or alternate subpermittee after the applicant has received a moose hunting permit. Current law requires an applicant for a moose hunting permit to designate that person's subpermittee and alternate subpermittee at the time of the application;

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	2 3	9. It prohibits the sale of the moose hunting permit subpermittee or alternate subpermittee designation and makes a violation of that prohibition a Class E crime; and

The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation creates the Moose Research and Management Fund within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and deposits up to \$25,000 from moose hunting application and permit fees into the fund. The bill also increases non-resident moose hunting permit fees by \$100. Assuming 400 non-resident permits, General Fund revenues would increase by \$11,250 in fiscal year 2011-12 and \$15,000 beginning in fiscal year 2012-13 and Other Special Revenue Funds revenue would increase by \$18,750 in fiscal year 2011-12 and \$25,000 beginning in fiscal year 2012-13.

This legislation eliminates the 3-chance and 6-chance moose application option for residents, allows people to accumulate points during years the person applies and does not receive a permit, allows people to use these points for additional chances in the moose permit lottery and allows people who are ineligible for a permit to continue purchasing applications in order to accumulate points for future lotteries. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife indicates there should be no net effect on General Fund revenue as a result of these provisions.
