COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 238, L.D. 294, Bill, "An Act To Allow Persons 70 Years of Age or Older Expanded Crossbow Privileges"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

**Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10952**, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. D, §7 and c. 614, §9, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

**§10952. Open seasons for hunting with bow and arrow and crossbow**

**1. Hunting with a bow and arrow.** A person may, except as otherwise provided in this Part, hunt any wild bird or wild animal with a hand-held bow and arrow during any open season on that bird or animal.

**2. Hunting with a crossbow; 70 years of age or older.** A person 70 years of age or older may hunt a wild bird or a wild animal with a crossbow during any open season on that wild bird or wild animal subject to the laws of this Part.

This subsection is repealed January 1, 2015.

**Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §10953, sub-§1**, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 419, §2 and affected by §12, is amended to read:

**1. Species and seasons.** Except as provided in this Part, a person may hunt bear with a crossbow during the open season on bear as provided in section 11251 and may hunt deer with a crossbow during the open firearm season on deer as provided in section 11401. This subsection does not authorize a person to hunt deer with a crossbow during an expanded archery season established under section 11403 or in an expanded archery zone or during the muzzle-loading-only deer hunting season established under section 11404, except as provided in subsection 1-A.

**Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §10953, sub-§1-A** is enacted to read:

**1-A. Hunting with a crossbow; 70 years of age or older.** A person 70 years of age or older may hunt deer with a crossbow during an expanded archery season established

1 under section 11403 or in an expanded archery zone or during the muzzle-loading-only  
2 deer hunting season established under section 11404.

3 This subsection is repealed January 1, 2015.

4 **Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §11403, sub-§2**, as amended by PL 2007, c. 163, §2 and  
5 affected by §3, is further amended to read:

6 **2. Open archery season on deer.** The commissioner shall by rule establish a  
7 regular archery-only season beginning at least 30 days prior and extending to the  
8 beginning of the regular deer hunting season, as described in section 11401, subsection 1,  
9 paragraph A, for the purpose of hunting deer with bow and arrow only. During the  
10 regular archery-only season on deer, except as provided in section 10952, subsection 2  
11 and section 10953, subsection 1-A, the following restrictions apply.

12 A. A person may not take a deer during a regular archery-only season unless that  
13 person uses a hand-held bow and broadhead arrow with the following specifications.

14 (1) Bows must have a minimum draw weight of 35 pounds.

15 (2) Arrowheads, including mechanical broadheads when open, must be at least  
16 7/8 inch in width.

17 B. A person may not carry firearms of any kind while hunting any species of wildlife  
18 with bow and arrow during the regular archery-only season on deer, except that a  
19 person who holds a license that allows hunting with firearms may carry a handgun.  
20 This paragraph may not be construed to prohibit a person who holds a valid permit to  
21 carry a concealed firearm pursuant to Title 25, section 2003 from carrying a firearm.

22 C. Except as provided in section 11109-A, subsection 3, if a person takes a deer with  
23 bow and arrow during the regular archery-only season on deer, that person is  
24 precluded from further hunting for deer during that year.

25 D. Except as provided in this subsection, the provisions of this Part concerning deer  
26 are applicable to the taking of deer with bow and arrow, including the transportation,  
27 registration and possession of deer taken by this method.

28 A person who violates this subsection commits a Class E crime.

29 **Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §11603, sub-§1-A** is enacted to read:

30 **1-A. Hunting moose with a crossbow; 70 years of age or older.** Notwithstanding  
31 subsection 1, a person 70 years of age or older may hunt moose with a crossbow subject  
32 to the laws of this Part.

33 This subsection is repealed January 1, 2015.

34 **SUMMARY**

35 This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment replaces  
36 the bill and until January 1, 2015 allows a person 70 years of age or older to hunt wild  
37 birds and wild animals with a crossbow during the open seasons for hunting with bow  
38 and arrow and to hunt moose with a crossbow.

### Fiscal Note

Potential current biennium revenue increase - General Fund

#### Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

Eliminates Class E crimes.

A reduction in fines will decrease General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Allowing a person 70 years of age or older to hunt wild birds and animals with a crossbow during the open seasons for hunting with bow and arrow and allowing that person to hunt moose with a crossbow could result in an increase in the number of crossbow permits issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. An estimate of the corresponding increase in General Fund revenue cannot be made at this time.
