Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph F in subparagraph (45) in the 2nd line (page 6, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "if" and inserting the following: 'as long as that employment is not subject to federal unemployment tax and'

This amendment clarifies that in order to be excepted from the definition of "employment" in the Employment Security Law a private investigator may not be subject to coverage under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act.
