1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §15102, sub-§1, ¶E**, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 560, Pt. H, §14
3 and affected by §17, is amended to read:

4 E. Steam heating boilers, hot water heating boilers ~~and~~ hot water supply boilers,
5 ~~except~~ boilers located in schoolhouses ~~or~~ and boilers owned by municipalities;
6 constructed and installed in accordance with the rules adopted by the board; or

7 **SUMMARY**

8 Under current law, all steam heating boilers, hot water heating boilers and hot water
9 supply boilers that are constructed and installed in accordance with the rules adopted by
10 the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Board of Boilers and Pressure
11 Vessels are exempt from a state-level boiler inspection program except for the boilers
12 owned and operated by municipalities and schoolhouses. This bill includes
13 municipalities and schoolhouses in the general exemption.
