RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Require Approval by a 2/3 Vote of Each Branch of the Legislature in Order To Raise a Tax

1 Constitutional amendment. Resolved: Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed: 4 Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Third, §24 is enacted to read: 5 **Section 24.** Tax increase. The Legislature may not enact legislation that raises a tax unless approved by a 2/3 vote of all the members elected to each House of the 6 7 Legislature. 8 ; and be it further 9 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. 10 Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for 11 holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November 12 13 following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment 14 proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 15 "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to require approval by a 2/3 vote 16 of all the members elected to each House of the Legislature in order to raise a tax?" 17 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question 18 and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 19 20 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of 21 State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the 22 23 amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it 24 25 further Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State 26 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies 27 28 of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum. 29 **SUMMARY** 30 This resolution proposes to amend the Constitution of Maine to require approval by a 2/3 vote of all the members elected to each House of the Legislature in order to raise a 31
