In lieu of a civil action under subsection 9, the commissioner may institute an administrative proceeding on any alleged violation of this section. If the commissioner institutes an administrative proceeding, the commissioner shall give notice and an opportunity for hearing under Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 4. Upon giving notice to a person who is alleged to be in violation of this section, the commissioner shall immediately prohibit that person from competing in an event within the State. This prohibition remains in effect for 30 days or until the commissioner's decision following the hearing is received, whichever occurs first, except that the prohibition period is extended by any delays of the hearing requested by the person against whom the violation is alleged.
27 28 29 30 31 32	If the person against whom the violation is alleged does not request a hearing or if, after a hearing, the commissioner finds the person has committed the violation, the commissioner shall prohibit that person from competing in any event within the State for a period of up to 2 years and shall also exclude the animal from competing in any event within the State for a period of up to one year. The commissioner may also, in an adjudicatory proceeding, in lieu of a civil action under subsection 9, impose an administrative penalty not to exceed \$1,000 for a violation of this section.

10	SUMMARY
11	This amendment allows the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources
12	to designate any person to serve as secretary for the Pull Events Commission instead of
13	an employee of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources. It also allows
14	the commissioner to establish and impose a range of penalties for the use of prohibited
15	substances in pulling events. Fines and prohibitions on competing are to be established
16	through rulemaking with a maximum fine set in law.
