2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10110 is enacted to read:
3	§10110. Hunting and fishing license; confidential
4 5	1. Indication of confidentiality. The commissioner shall allow an applicant for a hunting or fishing license to indicate that the applicant's e-mail address is confidential.
6 7 8	2. Confidential information. If a person indicates that the person's e-mail address submitted as part of the application process for a hunting or fishing license is confidential as provided in subsection 1, that information is confidential.
9 10 11	3. Exception. E-mails designated as confidential under this section is not confidential to department personnel or law enforcement officers or for purposes of court proceedings.
12	SUMMARY
13 14 15	This bill directs the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to allow an applicant for a hunting or fishing license to indicate that the applicant's e-mail address is confidential.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
