An Act To Create an Apprentice Trapper License

A. "In the presence of" means in visual and voice contact without the use of visual or audio enhancement devices, including binoculars and citizen band radios.
3. "Supervisor" means a person who is 18 years of age or older, has held a valid rapping license under this subchapter for 3 consecutive years and is trapping with a person holding an apprentice trapper license.
2. Supervisor required. A holder of an apprentice trapper license may not trap r than in the presence of a supervisor.
8. Supervisor responsibility. A supervisor shall ensure that the holder of an entice trapper license follows safe and ethical trapping protocol and adheres to the under this Part. A supervisor may not intentionally permit a person trapping under operatice trapper license with that supervisor to violate subsection 2.
4. Eligibility. A resident or nonresident 16 years of age or older who has never held id trapping license or junior trapping license in this State, or any other state, province ountry, is eligible to obtain an apprentice trapper license, except that a person may not sued an apprentice trapper license after having previously held an apprentice trapper se under this section. A person is eligible to obtain an apprentice trapper license out having successfully completed a trapper education course as described in section 18, subsection 7.
5. Expiration of apprentice trapper license. An apprentice trapper license is valid p to 12 calendar months and expires on June 30th.
6. Issuance; fee. The commissioner, through the commissioner's authorized agent, issue an apprentice trapper license to an eligible person. The fee for an apprentice per license is \$35 for residents and \$317 for nonresidents.
7. Restrictions. The holder of an apprentice trapper license is not eligible to obtain mit to trap for bear under section 12260-A.

1 SUMMARY

This bill creates an apprentice trapper license. An apprentice trapper license allows a person who has never held a trapping license to go trapping with an experienced trapper for up to one year without having to take a trapper education course. The holder of an apprentice trapper license must, while trapping, be under the direct supervision of an experienced trapper at all times. An apprentice trapper license allows a person to trap for all species that may be legally trapped, except black bear. The fee for an apprentice trapper license is the same as for a regular trapping license.
