1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §3014 is enacted to read:
3	§3014. Vegetable gardens
4	A correctional or detention facility operated by the department that has available
5	space on its grounds shall establish a vegetable garden for food to be used by the
6	department for feeding prisoners in that facility and other facilities operated by the
7	department. The prisoners of the facility shall maintain the vegetable garden for the
8	facility. The commissioner may adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this section.
9	Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5,
10	chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
11	SUMMARY
12	This bill requires each correctional and detention facility operated by the Department
13	of Corrections to establish a vegetable garden on its grounds to feed and be maintained by
14	the prisoners.
