- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 3 **Whereas,** the number of farm stands operating in the State increases markedly in 4 May; and
- 5 **Whereas,** it is desirable that this legislation take effect prior to this seasonal 6 increase; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
 therefore,
- 11 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §416 is enacted to read:

13 §416. Farm stand

- 14 <u>1. Definitions.</u> As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the
 15 <u>following terms have the following meanings.</u>
- A. "Farm stand" means a roadside stand at which locally grown farm products are
 offered for direct sale to the public and that is operated by a farmer or by a person
 who purchases the majority of the products sold at the farm stand from farmers.

2. Products. A product sold at a farm stand that was not grown by the owner of the
 farm stand must have the name and location of the farm where the product was grown
 affixed to the product or displayed on a sign in close proximity to the product.

- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
 legislation takes effect when approved.
- 24 SUMMARY
- This bill defines "farm stand" and requires that any product that was not grown by the person operating the farm stand must be labelled in such a way as to identify the product's origin.
