RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Limit the Number of Terms Served in Total

1 **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed:

Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. First, §2 is amended to read:

5 Section 2. Number of Representatives; terms; division of the State into districts for House of Representatives. The House of Representatives shall consist 6 of 151 members, to be elected by the qualified electors, and hold their office 2 years from 7 8 the day next preceding the first Wednesday in December following the general election. 9 A person may not serve more than 8 terms in total in the House of Representatives and the Senate. The Legislature which convenes in 1983 and every 10th year thereafter shall 10 11 cause the State to be divided into districts for the choice of one Representative for each district. The number of Representatives shall be divided into the number of inhabitants of 12 the State exclusive of foreigners not naturalized according to the latest Federal Decennial 13 14 Census or a State Census previously ordered by the Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial Census, to determine a mean population figure for each Representative 15 District. Each Representative District shall be formed of contiguous and compact 16 territory and shall cross political subdivision lines the least number of times necessary to 17 18 establish as nearly as practicable equally populated districts. Whenever the population of a municipality entitles it to more than one district, all whole districts shall be drawn 19 20 within municipal boundaries. Any population remainder within the municipality shall be 21 included in a district with contiguous territory and shall be kept intact.

; and be it further

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date.
Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to limit the number of terms of office for State Senators and members of the House of Representatives to no more than 8 terms in total?"

32 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding 33 square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 34 35 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 36 37 review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment 38 39 becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it 40 further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State
 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies
 of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.
