Removing the exemption of persons doing certain incidental electrical work from the electrician licensing requirements will eliminate the minor decrease in dedicated revenue to the Electricans' Examining Board within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation.

Additional costs to the Electricians' Examining Board within the Office of Licensing and Registration, Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to convene the required working group to conduct the required review and to submit the required report can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
