1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6602, sub-§3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and
3	8, is amended to read:
4	B. Shall hire the necessary employees to manage and operate their school food
5	service programs, including a professional food service director who meets all
6	applicable qualifications of the federal Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010,
7	Public Law 111-296. The food service director must attend a minimum of 4 hours of
8	training per year related to the duties of the food service director. A food service
9	director may be hired by more than one school administrative unit pursuant to a
10	cooperative agreement entered into under chapter 113-A.
11	SUMMARY
12	This bill requires all school administrative units to hire a professional food service
13	director. The bill allows school administrative units to join in cooperative agreements to
14	hire such directors.
