To be considered a declared write-in candidate under this section, a person must file a declaration of write-in candidacy with the municipal clerk, on a form approved by the municipal clerk, on or before 5 p.m. on the 45th day prior to the election. The candidate must meet all the other qualifications for that office.

In any city election, a voter may write in the name and municipality of residence of any a person declared under this subsection for whom the voter desires to vote in the blank space provided at the end of the list of candidates for office. A sticker may not be used to vote for a write-in candidate in any city election other than a primary election. To be considered a declared write-in candidate under this subsection, a person must file a declaration of write-in candidacy with the clerk, on a form approved by the clerk, on or before 5 p.m. on the 45th day prior to the election. The candidate must meet all the other qualifications for that office.
