An Act Regarding Write-in Candidates in Municipal and City Elections

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2528, sub-§11** is enacted to read:

3 **11. Write-in candidates.** To be considered a declared write-in candidate under this
4 section, a person must file a declaration of write-in candidacy with the municipal clerk,
5 on a form approved by the municipal clerk, on or before 5 p.m. on the 45th day prior to
6 the election. The candidate must meet all the other qualifications for that office.

7 **Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §2554, sub-§2,** as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and
8 Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6; c. 9, §2; and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is
9 further amended to read:

10 **2. Write-in votes.** In any city election, a voter may write in the name and
11 municipality of residence of ~~any~~ a person declared under this subsection for whom the
12 voter desires to vote in the blank space provided at the end of the list of candidates for
13 office. A sticker may not be used to vote for a write-in candidate in any city election
14 other than a primary election. To be considered a declared write-in candidate under this
15 subsection, a person must file a declaration of write-in candidacy with the clerk, on a
16 form approved by the clerk, on or before 5 p.m. on the 45th day prior to the election. The
17 candidate must meet all the other qualifications for that office.

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This bill requires a write-in candidate for a municipal or city election to file a
20 declaration of candidacy on or before 45 days prior to the election and meet all other
21 qualifications for office.
