4 5 6	C. A resident may train up to 6 dogs at any one time on bear from July 1st to the first day of the open season on hunting bear, except in those portions of Washington County and Hancock County that are situated south of Route 9.

8 9 10	This bill removes the provision of law that prohibits the training of dogs on bear in those portions of Washington County and Hancock County that are situated south of Route 9.
