Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

13 'An Act Regarding the Public Utilities Commission's Ability To Use Certain Funds'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

16 'Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §3210, sub-§7, as amended by PL 2009, c. 329, Pt. B, §1, is
17 further amended to read:

18 7. Information. The To the extent that funding is available, the commission shall 19 inform electricity consumers in this State of the benefits of electricity generated in this 20 State using renewable resources and of the opportunities available in this State to 21 purchase electricity that is generated using those resources, including, but not limited to, 22 the green power offer and other green power supply products and renewable energy credit 23 products certified under section 3212-A. The commission may not promote any 24 renewable resources over others. The commission may apply for, receive and expend 25 grant money from the United States Department of Energy and other government 26 agencies for this purpose. Notwithstanding section 3211-A, subsection 5, the commission 27 also may use up to \$100,000 per year from the conservation program fund established 28 under section 3211-A, subsection 5 to support the purposes of this subsection. The 29 commission may create or cause to be created a brand or logo to identify Maine 30 renewable resources, including the green power offer and other green power supply 31 products and renewable energy credit products certified under section 3212-A, to 32 consumers. The commission shall register any mark or logo created pursuant to this 33 subsection with the United States Patent and Trademark Office or in accordance with 34 Title 10, chapter 301-A, or both. Any brand or logo created pursuant to this subsection 35 may only be used in accordance with the purposes of this subsection as approved by the 36 commission.

Sec. 2. Authorized expenditures. During the 2-year period of calendar years 2011 and 2012, the Public Utilities Commission may expend an amount not to exceed \$100,000 from the conservation program fund established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 10110 for the purposes of Title 35-A, section 3210, subsection 7.'

SUMMARY

This amendment strikes and replaces the bill and eliminates the Public Utilities Commission's authority to use up to \$100,000 per year from the conservation program fund to provide information to consumers regarding renewable energy generated in the State. This amendment permits the commission to use a total of \$100,000 for that purpose during the calendar years 2011 and 2012.
