The amendment prohibits a certified candidate under the Maine Clean Election Act from soliciting or accepting contributions greater than \$10,000 for a political action committee for which the candidate is a principal officer, fund-raiser or decision maker.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation could result in Other Special Revenue Funds savings due to decreased payments to qualified candidates. This analysis assumes a certain number of candidates who would otherwise run as Maine Clean Electior Act candidates will opt out of the program in order to establish a political action committee and accept more than \$10,000 in contributions. During the 2010 election cycle, \$334,000 in Maine Clean Election Funds was paid to candidates who established leadership political action committees.
