HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 912, L.D. 1221, Bill, "An Act To Encourage Prompt Payments by the State When It Contracts with Outside Agencies"

Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, many contracts entered into by state agencies are negotiated with a start date that coincides with the beginning of the fiscal year, July 1st; and

Whereas, in order to ensure that the parties to a contract have notice of the changes made by this legislation, this legislation needs to take effect as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'


Amend the bill by adding after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. Application. This Act applies to all contracts entered into by a state agency on or after the effective date of this Act.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'

SUMMARY

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill and specifies that the legislation applies to contracts entered into on or after the effective date.
