COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 933, L.D. 1242

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §10264, as reallocated by RR 2011, c. 1, §14, is amended to read:

§10264. Maine Deer Management Fund

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4 The Predator Control and Deer Habitat Fund Maine Deer Management Fund, referred 5 to in this section as "the fund," is established within the department as a nonlapsing fund to be used by the commissioner to fund or assist in funding predator control and to 6 7 enhance deer habitat. The commissioner shall establish on the department's online 8 licensing system checkoff options that allow a person to donate money for predator 9 control or deer habitat enhancement. The checkoff options must be prominently 10 displayed and contain web links to information about how the checkoff revenues have been and will be used. The commissioner shall also print in a prominent place on every 11 12 paper application for a hunting license checkoff options that allow a person to donate 13 money to the fund for predator control or deer habitat enhancement. Revenues from the 14 checkoffs must be deposited in the fund and used for purposes indicated by the checkoffs.

15 Notwithstanding section 10801, subsection 4, \$2 of each deer registration fee 16 collected under section 12301-A, subsection 3, paragraph C must be deposited in the fund. Fifty percent of the funds deposited in the fund from the deer registration fees must 17 18 be used for predator control purposes and 50% of the deposited fees must be used to 19 enhance deer habitat. The commissioner may accept and deposit into the fund monetary 20 gifts, donations or other contributions from public or private sources for the purposes 21 specified in this section. The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, 22 funds and accounts. The department shall report annually to the joint standing committee 23 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters on the fund and its utilization. 24

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 933, L.D. 1242

It requires the commissioner to direct the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory Council members to convene stakeholder groups at least annually in strategic areas of the State where deer populations need to be enhanced.

It renames the existing Predator Control and Deer Habitat Fund the "Maine Deer Management Fund." It requires that every application for a hunting license include checkoff options that allow a person to donate money to the fund for predator control or deer habitat enhancement. It also requires that \$2 of every deer registration fee be credited to the Maine Deer Management Fund.

The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation directs that \$2 of each deer registration fee be deposited into the Maine Deer Management Fund and will result in a reduction of General Fund revenue of \$38,000 and a corresponding increase in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue beginning in fiscal year 2012-13. This estimate is based upon the number of deer registrations during the 2011 hunting season. The bill includes an Other Special Revenue Funds allocation to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife of \$38,000 in fiscal year 2012-13.

Additional costs to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife associated with rulemaking and establishing a process on paper hunting license applications for a person to donate money to the Maine Deer Management Fund can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
