the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy, utilities and technology matters in its
annual report for the years 2011, 2012 and 2013. The committee may submit legislation
to the next session of the Legislature based on the report submitted by the commission
pursuant to this section.'

5 SUMMARY

This amendment directs the Public Utilities Commission, the Governor's Office of Energy Independence and Security and the Office of the Public Advocate to confer with comparable agencies in other states that are participants in the regional transmission organization for New England to develop a plan to pursue transparency and accountability at the regional transmission organization. It requires the Public Utilities Commission, the Governor's Office of Energy Independence and Security and the Office of the Public Advocate to develop model governance requirements for a regional transmission organization and formally propose the model to comparable agencies in other states. The commission must report on the progress of these efforts in its annual report for the years 2011, 2012 and 2013.

Directing the Public Utilities Commission, the Office of Public Advocate and the Office of Energy Independence and Security to advocate for greater transparency and accountability in appropriate forums on behalf of Maine electricity consumers who are affected by regional transmission organizations, to confer with comparable agencies in other New England states to develop a plan to pursue transparency and accountability at regional transmission organizations, to develop model governance requirements and formally propose the model in other states as well as requiring the PUC to report on the progress of the plan will result in minor increased costs that each agency can absorb within its respective existing budgeted resources.
