11 12	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:
13	'Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §435 is enacted to read:
14	§435. Added jurisdiction to prosecute
15 16 17 18	1. In addition to the State's having jurisdiction pursuant to section 7 to convict a person under section 432 or 433, the State has jurisdiction to convict a person under this chapter when that person is physically located outside of this State and the prohibited conduct:
19 20	A. Occurs outside of this State and the victim of the crime is a resident of this State at the time of the crime; and
21	B. Is sufficient under this section to constitute a crime in this State.
22 23 24 25	2. As used in this section, "resident" means a person who lives in this State either permanently or for an extended period. "Extended period" includes, but is not limited to, the period of time a student attends a school or college and the period of time a person serving in the Armed Forces of the United States is stationed in this State.'
26	SUMMARY
27 28 29 30	This amendment replaces the bill and creates a section regarding added jurisdiction that applies to the whole chapter on computer crimes. The new provision, like the bill, gives the State jurisdiction to convict a person residing outside the State who commits criminal invasion of computer privacy or aggravated criminal invasion of computer privacy if the victim was a resident of the State at the time of the crime.

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
