SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1044, L.D. 1418, Bill, "An Act To Allow Table Games at a Facility Licensed To Operate Slot Machines on January 1, 2011"

Amend the amendment in section 4 in paragraph C-1 in the 7th line (page 3, line 13 in amendment) by striking out the following: "\$100,000" and inserting the following: '\$50,000'

Amend the amendment in section 4 in paragraph C-1 in the 8th line (page 3, line 14 in amendment) by striking out the following: "20" and inserting the following: '10'

Amend the amendment in section 4 in paragraph C-1 in the 11th line (page 3, line 17 in amendment) by striking out the following: "20-year" and inserting the following: '10-year'

This amendment changes the initial gaming table fee from \$100,000 for a period of 20 years to \$50,000 for a period of 10 years.

This floor amendment decreases the initial table game license fee from \$100,000 for 20 years to \$50,000 for 10 years and would result in a \$700,000 decrease in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue for the 14 table games anticipated.
