SENATE AMENDMENT "D" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1044, L.D. 1418, Bill, "An Act To Allow Table Games at a Facility Licensed To Operate Slot Machines on January 1, 2011"

Amend the amendment in section 10 in subsection 2-C in paragraph A in the first line (page 6, line 3 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Nine" and inserting the following: 'Eight'

Amend the amendment in section 10 in subsection 2-C in paragraph C in the first line (page 6, line 9 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Two" and inserting the following: 'One'

Amend the amendment in section 10 in subsection 2-C in paragraph C in the last line (page 6, line 10 in amendment) by striking out the following: "and"

Amend the amendment in section 10 in subsection 2-C in paragraph D in the last line (page 6, line 15 in amendment) by striking out the following: "2013." and inserting the following: '2013; and'

Amend the amendment in section 10 in subsection 2-C by inserting after paragraph D the following:

'E. Two percent of net table game income must be forwarded directly to a federally recognized Indian tribe in the State licensed to conduct high-stakes beano on January 1, 2010.'

SUMMARY


This amendment provides that 2% of net table game income must be forwarded directly to a federally recognized Indian tribe in the State licensed to conduct high-stakes beano on January 1, 2010. It reduces the net table game income that must be deposited to the General Fund for administrative expenses of the Department of Public Safety,

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## Fiscal Note

Contingent current biennium revenue decrease - General Fund  
Contingent current biennium revenue increase - Other Special Revenue Funds

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment proposes to reduce the amount of net table game income from the Bangor facility distributed to the General Fund from 9% to 8%, reduce the amount distributed to the municipality from 2% to 1% and distribute 2% to a federally recognized Indian tribe. While the total tax remains at 16% of net table game income, the estimated annual net effect would be a reduction of \$53,120 in the General Fund revenue shown on the committee amendment, a reduction of \$53,120 to the municipality and a payment of \$106,240 to the Indian tribe. The payment from the Bangor facility is contingent upon municipal approval of table games.
