H-1. 5 MRSA §17859, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 2011, c. 380, Pt. MMM, 13 §1, is amended to read: 14 1. Restoration to service. Any state employee or teacher who has reached normal 15 retirement age and who retires on or after July September 1, 2011 may be restored to 16 service for up to 5 years. The decision to hire a retired state employee or retired teacher 17 under this section is at the discretion of the appointing authority. The retired state 18 employee or retired teacher must have had a bona fide termination of employment in 19 accordance with state and federal laws and rules, may not return to employment after 20 retirement with the same employer for at least 30 calendar days after the termination of 21 employment and may not return to employment before the effective date of the person's 22 retirement.' 23 Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter 24 or section number to read consecutively. 25 **SUMMARY** 26 This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" by adding a part that amends 27 the option for state employees and teachers who return to work subsequent to their 28 retirement to apply to those individuals who retire after September 1, 2011 rather than 29 those who retire on or after July 1, 2011.
