### An Act To Further Improve Maine's Health Insurance Law

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §3957, sub-§2,** as enacted by PL 2011, c. 90, Pt. B, §8, is  
3 amended to read:

4 **2. Maximum assessment.** The board shall assess each insurer an amount not to  
5 exceed \$4 per month per covered person enrolled in medical insurance insured, reinsured  
6 or administered by the insurer. An insurer may not be assessed on policies or contracts  
7 insuring federal or state employees, except for policies or contracts insuring Legislators  
8 and their dependents, in which case the insurer shall directly bill Legislators for the cost  
9 of the assessment.

10 **SUMMARY**

11 This bill amends "An Act To Modify Rating Practices for Individual and Small  
12 Group Health Plans and To Encourage Value-based Purchasing of Health Care Services"  
13 to remove the exemption from assessment imposed on Legislators and their dependents,  
14 thus requiring insurers to pay the \$4 per month per person assessment for policies  
15 insuring Legislators and their dependents. The bill provides that insurers shall directly  
16 bill Legislators for the costs of the assessment.
