Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$9,167 in fiscal year 2011-12 for the prorated anticipated increase in indigent legal services costs. The ongoing annual cost is estimated to be \$22,000. It also includes a General Fund appropriation of \$21,848 in fiscal year 2011-12 and \$153,725 in fiscal year 2012-13 for the Correctional Impact Reserve program. This estimate reflects the net effect of savings to county facilities and increased costs to state facilities associated with the enhanced penalty provisions.
