# An Act To Facilitate Recovery of Debts Owed to the State for Indigent Legal Services

## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §5276-A, sub-§8, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 501, Pt. B, §21, is
amended to read:

4 8. Disclosure of information. In any civil or criminal action in which a fine, forfeiture, order to pay or money judgment is entered in favor of the State or any agency 5 or department thereof, or in any action in which counsel is appointed assigned for an 6 indigent party, the court may require the party so indebted to the State, its agencies or 7 department, or the party for whom counsel has been appointed assigned, to provide that 8 9 party's social security number and other financial information under oath and on such 10 forms as may be prepared by the Judicial Department in order to effectuate the purposes of this section. The Judicial Department may disclose social security numbers and 11 financial information obtained in accordance with this subsection to agencies or 12 departments of the State and to private collection agencies working under contract for the 13 State for the purpose of collection of the amounts owed. 14

#### SUMMARY

16 The purpose of this bill is to aid the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services in 17 the collection of amounts owed to the commission for legal services. This bill authorizes 18 the Judicial Department to disclose social security numbers and financial information to 19 agencies or departments of the State, including the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal 20 Services, and to private collection agencies working under contract for the State for the 21 purpose of collection of the amounts owed.
