1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§3, ¶F, as amended by PL 2001, c. 628, §2 and affected by §5, is further amended to read:
4 5	F. The canning, processing, preserving, freezing, drying, marketing, storing, packing for shipment or distribution of:
6	(1) Agricultural produce;
7	(2) Meat and fish products; and
8	(3) Perishable foods.
9 10 11	Individuals employed, directly or indirectly, for or at an egg processing facility that has over 300,000 laying birds must be paid overtime in accordance with this subsection; and
12 13	<b>Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§3, ¶¶H, I and J,</b> as enacted by PL 2001, c. 628 §3 and affected by §5, are repealed.
14	<b>Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§3, ¶K</b> is enacted to read:
15 16 17 18	K. A driver or driver's helper who is subject to the provisions of 49 United States Code, Section 31502 as amended or to regulations adopted pursuant to that section who is governed by the applicable provisions of federal law with respect to payment of overtime.
19 20 21 22 23 24	Nothing in this paragraph may be construed to limit the rights of parties to negotiate rates of pay for drivers and driver's helpers who are represented for purposes of collective bargaining by a labor organization certified by the National Labor Relations Board or who are employed by an entity that is party to a contract with the Federal Government or an agency of the Federal Government that dictates the minimum hourly rate of pay to be paid a driver or driver's helper.

26 27	This bill conforms Maine law to federal law as it pertains to payment of overtime to truck drivers and driver's helpers.
