11 12	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and inserting the following:
13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15	Whereas, the elver fishing season begins March 22, 2012; and
16 17 18	Whereas, there are widespread violations in the elver fishery due to the dramatic increase in the price per pound of elvers and harsher penalties need to be in effect to combat the violations; and
19 20	Whereas, a change in the closed periods will help elver fishing license holders protect their gear from molestation; and
21 22 23	Whereas, a requirement for elver dealer's license holders to return their product to a permanent establishment will strengthen the position of licensed elver dealers of this State in an international market and help the economy of this State; and
24 25 26 27	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
28	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

A person may leave an elver fyke net or a Sheldon eel trap in the waters of the State during the closed period if the net or trap is left in a condition that prevents the capture of elvers. The terminal portion of a fyke net cod end must contain a rigid device with an opening not less than 3 inches in diameter and not exceeding 6 inches in length that is unobstructed by any other portion of

§6864. Elver dealer's license

- 1. License required. A person may not buy, possess, ship, transport or sell elvers without an elver dealer's license. It is unlawful for a person to possess elvers prior to the beginning of the elver season and to possess elvers 5 days beyond the end of the elver season pursuant to section 6575.
- 2. License limited. An elver dealer's license authorizes the licensed activities at only one establishment or with only one vehicle permanent facility.
- 3. Supplemental license. A supplemental license must be obtained for each <u>vehicle</u> or additional establishment or vehicle permanent facility.
- **4.** Fee. The fee for an elver dealer's license is \$1,213 and the fee for each supplemental license is \$63.
- 5. Disposition of fees. All fees collected under this section accrue to the Eel and Elver Management Fund established in section 6505-D, except that \$376 accrues to the General Fund for each elver dealer's license sold under this section and \$52 accrues to the General Fund for each supplemental license sold under this section.
- 7. Violation. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 \$2,000 may be adjudged.
- 8. Reporting. A dealer licensed under this section shall report the total annual harvest of elvers received by that dealer to the department within 30 days after the end of the elver fishing season. The commissioner shall prescribe how that data and any other information necessary for a meaningful analysis of the elver harvest are reported to the department.
- 9. Authorized representatives. A person who holds an elver dealer's license may identify authorized representatives to act on the license holder's behalf to purchase elvers at locations other than the permanent facility. The elver dealer's license holder must identify authorized representatives on forms provided by the department.
- 10. Purchase of elvers. A person who holds an elver dealer's license, or the authorized representative of that person under subsection 9, may purchase elvers from licensed harvesters at locations other than the permanent facility identified on the license holder's license. The license holder or the license holder's authorized representative shall keep a record that identifies each harvester from which elvers were purchased and the amount of elvers purchased from each harvester. The license holder or the license holder's authorized representative shall make the record available for inspection by a marine patrol officer.

24	SUMMARY			
25 26	This amendment replaces the bill and adds an emergency preamble and clause. It does the following.			
27 28 29 30	1. It changes the suspension for molesting elver fishing gear from a one-year license suspension to a 3-year suspension for the first offense and adds that a 2nd offense results in permanent revocation of the elver fishing license. It increases the fine for molesting elver fishing gear from between \$100 and \$500 to \$2,000.			
31 32	2. It creates an elver fishing lottery system and adds a suspension of eligibility in the elver lotteries for fishing without an elver fishing license. The first offense results in a			

- elver lotteries for fishing without an elver fishing license. The first offense results in a one-year suspension of eligibility. A 2nd offense results in a permanent loss of eligibility in the elver lotteries. It increases the fine for fishing without a license from between \$100 and \$500 to \$2,000 and makes a 2nd or subsequent offense a Class D crime.
- 3. It adds a license suspension for an adjudication of untagged elver gear. The first offense results in a one-year license suspension. A 2nd offense results in permanent

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- revocation of the license holder's license. It increases the fine for untagged elver gear from between \$100 and \$500 to \$2,000.
- 4. It adds a license suspension for elver fishing during the closed season or a closed period. The first offense results in a one-year license suspension. A 2nd offense results in permanent revocation of the license holder's license.
- 5. It adds a license suspension for violation of an elver dealer's license. The first offense results in a one-year license suspension. A 2nd offense results in permanent revocation of the license holder's license. It increases the fine for a violation of an elver dealer's license from between \$100 and \$500 to \$2,000.
- 6. It lifts the moratorium on elver fishing licenses and creates a dual elver fishing lottery system to keep the fishery at the same level as it was December 31, 2011.
- 7. It requires the elver gear lottery and elver license lottery to begin in 2013. Gear authorized by licenses that are not renewed is placed in the elver gear lottery. Each lottery entrant can win authorization to use only one piece of gear.
- 8. It allows only current elver fishing license holders who hold a dip net authorization to enter the elver gear lottery to exchange authorization to use a dip net for authorization to use a fyke net, if any are available.
- 9. It sets up the elver license lottery to be held after the elver gear lottery for any remaining gear authorizations left over after the elver gear lottery. Each winner of the elver license lottery wins the ability to purchase an elver fishing license and authorization to use one piece of gear. The number of licenses available is based on and is the same as the number of gear pieces available in the elver gear lottery.
- 10. It changes the closed period for elver harvesting, which in current law is from noon Friday to noon Sunday, and splits the days in the closed period. The closed period is changed to from noon Tuesday to noon Wednesday and from noon Saturday to noon Sunday.
- 11. It adds that it is unlawful for an elver dealer to possess elvers prior to the beginning of the elver season and 5 days beyond the end of the season. This allows dealers to package and ship product after the season ends.
- 12. It restricts the elver dealer's license to allow activities at only one permanent facility. A supplemental license is required for vehicles and for additional facilities.
- 13. It allows an elver dealer's license holder to identify authorized representatives to purchase elvers for the dealer at locations other than the permanent facility.
- 14. It requires the elver dealer's license holder or the license holder's authorized representative to purchase elvers from licensed harvesters and requires the elver dealer or authorized representative to keep a record that identifies each harvester from which elvers were purchased and the amount of elvers purchased from each harvester. The records must be available for inspection by a marine patrol officer.
- 15. It requires the elver dealer's license holder or the license holder's authorized representative to transport elvers to a permanent facility identified on the license holder's license prior to shipping or transporting elvers outside state limits.

16. It provides for the Commissioner of Marine Resources to make routine technical
rules to set up the elver lotteries and the additional requirements for elver dealer's license
holders.

17. It adds an appropriations and allocations section.

Establishes new Class D crimes.

The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation creates an elver license lottery which is expected to increase Other Special Revenue Funds revenue to the Department of Marine Resources by \$5,000 beginning in fiscal year 2012-13. This analysis assumes 200 lottery applications per year. The bill includes a corresponding Other Special Revenue Funds allocation to the department in fiscal year 2012-13.
