Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall submit an application for a waiver from the requirements of federal law and regulations to the 19 20 United States Department of Agriculture. The waiver must seek approval for the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its rules to require a person to show 21 22 photographic identification in order to use an electronic benefits transfer card when it is 23 requested in an establishment that accepts Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program 24 benefits. The Department of Health and Human Services shall submit the application for a waiver by October 1, 2012; and be it further 25 26 Sec. 2. Department of Health and Human Services to continue to develop 27 strategies to combat fraud and abuse. Resolved: That the Department of Health 28 and Human Services shall continue to develop strategies to combat fraud and abuse in the 29 use of electronic benefits transfer cards to access Supplemental Nutritional Assistance 30 Program benefits. The Department of Health and Human Services shall report to the joint 31 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services 32 matters on its progress in developing new strategies to combat fraud and abuse in the 33 Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program by December 1, 2012.

SUMMARY

 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the resolve. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to submit an application for a waiver from the requirements of federal law and regulations to the United States Department of Agriculture. The waiver must seek approval for the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its rules to require a person to show photographic identification in order to use an electronic benefits transfer card when it is requested in an establishment that accepts Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program benefits. The Department of Health and Human Services is required to seek the waiver by October 1, 2012. The Department of Health and Human Services is also required to continue to develop strategies to combat fraud and abuse in the use of electronic benefits transfer cards in the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program and report its progress in developing new strategies to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters by December 1, 2012.
