Amend the bill by striking out all of Parts I, O and X.

Amend the bill by striking out all of Part II and inserting the following:
'PART II
Sec. II-1. PL 2011, c. 380, Pt. JJJ, §1 is amended to read:
Sec. JJJ-1. Transfer from Other Special Revenue Funds to unappropriated surplus of the General Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall transfer \$43,000,000 \$104,400,000 on June 30, 2012 from Other Special Revenue Funds to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund. On July 1, 2012, the State Controller shall transfer \$43,000,000 \$104,400,000 from the General Fund unappropriated surplus to Other Special Revenue Funds as repayment. This transfer is considered an interfund advance.
PART JJ
Sec. JJ-1. 36 MRSA §5117 is enacted to read:
§5117. Equalization of tax rates
The State Tax Assessor shall calculate annually the average effective tax rate on all state and local taxes paid by the top 1% of income earners and the bottom 99% of income earners based on the most recent tax incidence study completed by the bureau. The State Tax Assessor shall calculate an income tax amount for each taxpayer that equalizes this tax rate on the top 1% of income earners and the bottom 99% of income earners. This

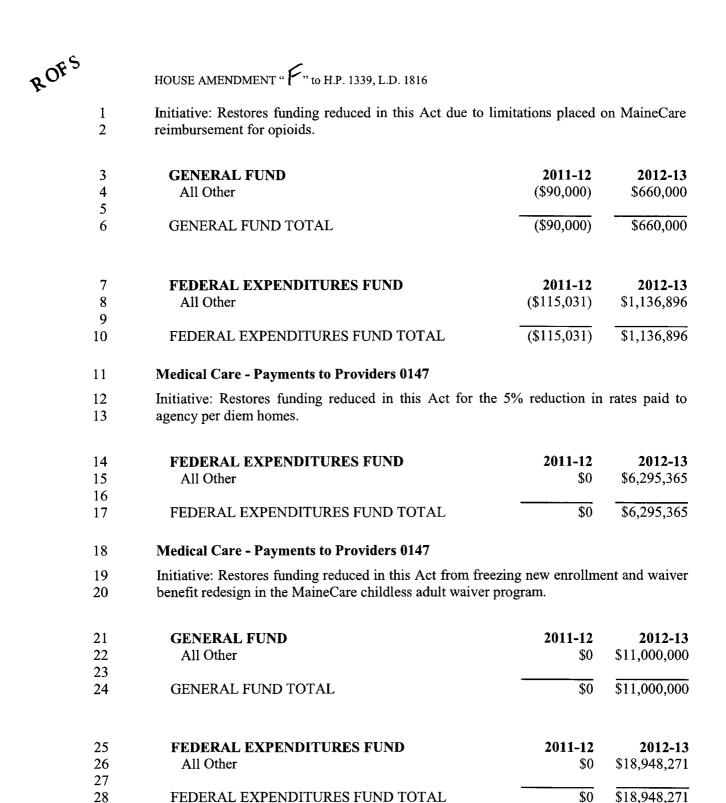

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment reduces the General Fund cost of the bill by \$83,458 in fiscal year 2011-12 and \$875,366 in fiscal year 2012-13. The amendment implements an income tax equalization assessment to generate additional General Fund revenue that provides the resources to restore funding for a number of MaineCare and other programs that are proposed for reductions in the bill. The amendment also increases the one-day borrowing from Other Special Revenue Funds by \$2,400,000 and transfers \$15,000,000 from General Fund unappropriated surplus to the Maine Budget Stabilization Fund in fiscal year 2012-13.
