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PART B

Sec. B-1. **Public Utilities Commission to examine certain issues.** The Public Utilities Commission shall convene a stakeholder group to examine financial 4 issues related to the loss of customers by water utilities and the effect the loss has on the utilities' ability to pay for infrastructure as well as the effects on remaining customers. The commission shall invite participation from a broad range of interested entities. The 7 stakeholder group shall examine whether there are appropriate means by which 8 contributions to system costs may be collected from customers who discontinue service 9 or from property owners whose property has been served or may be served by the system 10 and if so how the collection may be done in a manner that is just and reasonable. The group may also examine readiness-to-service charges and requirements to take service or 12 other mechanisms and shall seek to develop appropriate models for addressing issues 13 created by the loss of customers by water utilities. The commission shall report the 14 findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group, together with the commission's 15 analysis of those findings and recommendations, and any proposals of the stakeholder 16 group for changes to law to implement its recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy, utilities and technology 17 18 matters by February 15, 2013. The committee may report out a bill on the subject matter 19 of the report to the First Regular Session of the 126th Legislature.'

SUMMARY

21 This amendment removes a provision of the bill that authorizes the board of trustees 22 of the Bingham Water District to adopt a resolution that provides that the minimum 23 charge for water service continues to apply to property that is voluntarily disconnected 24 from the system.

25 This amendment directs the Public Utilities Commission to convene a stakeholder 26 group to examine issues relating to the loss of customers by water utilities and the effect 27 this has on the utilities' ability to pay for infrastructure and the effect on remaining 28 customers. The commission is directed to invite participation from a broad range of interested entities. The stakeholder group is directed to examine whether there are 29 30 appropriate means by which contributions to system costs may be collected from 31 customers who discontinue service or from property owners whose property has been served or may be served by the system and if so how the collection might be done in a 32 manner that is just and reasonable. The commission must report the findings and 33 34 recommendations of the stakeholder group, together with any proposals for changes to law to implement the recommendations, to the joint standing committee of the 35 36 Legislature having jurisdiction over energy, utilities and technology matters by February 15, 2013. The committee is authorized to report out a bill on the subject to the First 37 38 Regular Session of the 126th Legislature.

An Act To Amend the Charter of the Bingham Water District

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill amends the charter of the Bingham Wter District to change the procedure by which the board of trustees receives compensation and changes the vote to amend the bylaws to require only a simple majority. The Public Utilities Commission (PUC) is required to convene a stakeholder group to examine issues relating to the loss of customers by water utilities, including the effects this has on utilities' ability to pay for infrastructure as well as the impact on remaining customers. The PUC must report the findings of the stakeholder group to the Legislature by February 15, 2013. These provisions result in a minor increase in costs to the PUC which can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
