HOUSE AMENDMENT "G" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1405,
9 L.D. 1903, Bill, "An Act To Make Additional Supplemental Appropriations and
10 Allocations and To Change Certain Provisions of the Law for the Fiscal Years Ending
11 June 30, 2012 and June 30, 2013"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of Part AAA and inserting the following:

'PART AAA

14

Sec. AAA-1. 5 MRSA §1582, sub-§4, as amended by PL 2011, c. 1, Pt. S, §1, is
15 further amended to read:

16

4. Use of savings; personal services funds. Savings accrued from unused funding
17 of employee benefits may not be used to increase services provided by employees.
18 Accrued salary savings generated within an appropriation or allocation for Personal
19 Services may be used for the payment of nonrecurring Personal Services costs only
20 within the account where the savings exist. Accrued savings generated from vacant
21 positions within a General Fund account's appropriation for Personal Services may be
22 used to offset Personal Services shortfalls in other General Fund accounts that occur as a
23 direct result of Personal Services appropriation reductions for projected vacancies, and
24 accrued savings generated within a Highway Fund account's allocations for Personal
25 Services may be used to offset Personal Services shortfalls in other Highway Fund
26 accounts that occur as a direct result of Personal Services allocation reductions for
27 projected vacancies; except that the transfer of such accrued savings is subject to review
28 by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations
29 and financial affairs. Costs related to acting capacity appointments and emergency,
30 unbudgeted overtime for which it is impractical to budget in advance may be used with
31 the approval of the appointing authority. Other actions such as retroactive compensation
32 for reclassifications or reallocations and retroactive or one-time settlements related to
33 arbitrator or court decisions must be recommended by the department or agency head and
34 approved by the State Budget Officer. Salary and employee benefits savings may not be
35 used to fund recurring Personal Services actions either in the account where the savings
36 exist or in another account. At the close of each fiscal year, except for the Division of
37 Forest Protection account within the Department of Conservation, the ~~Disproportionate~~
38 ~~Share~~— Riverview Psychiatric Center and the ~~Disproportionate Share~~— Dorothea Dix

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1 Psychiatric Center accounts within the Department of Health and Human Services and the
2 Education in the Unorganized Territory account within the Department of Education, any
3 unexpended General Fund Personal Services appropriations to executive branch agencies
4 including accounts that are authorized to carry unexpended balances forward must lapse
5 to the Salary Plan program, General Fund account in the Department of Administrative
6 and Financial Services.

7 **Sec. AAA-2. 34-B MRSA §1409, sub-§9, ¶A**, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 459,
8 §7, is amended to read:

9 A. The chief administrative officer shall ~~apply the benefits toward~~ deposit any such
10 funding received for the care and treatment of the resident ~~in accordance with charges~~
11 ~~made by the department as General Fund undedicated revenue.~~

12 **Sec. AAA-3. 34-B MRSA §1409, sub-§13**, as amended by PL 2005, c. 256, §4,
13 is repealed.

14 **Sec. AAA-4. 34-B MRSA §1409, sub-§14**, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 528, Pt. Q,
15 §6 and affected by Pt. RRR and enacted by c. 591, Pt. Q, §6 and amended by PL 2005, c.
16 236, §3, is repealed.

17 **Sec. AAA-5. 34-B MRSA §1409, sub-§15**, as amended by PL 2011, c. 1, Pt. S,
18 §2, is further amended to read:

19 **15. General Fund accounts; disproportionate share hospital match.** The
20 commissioner shall establish General Fund accounts to provide ~~the General Fund match~~
21 ~~for eligible disproportionate share hospital components in~~ for the care and treatment of
22 residents of the Riverview Psychiatric Center and the Dorothea Dix Psychiatric Center.
23 Any unencumbered balances of General Fund appropriations remaining at the end of each
24 fiscal year must be carried forward to be used for the same purposes. Available
25 unencumbered balances at the end of each fiscal year in the Personal Services line
26 category of the accounts may be transferred to the All Other line category by financial
27 order upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the
28 Governor. Reimbursement received from the Medicaid program for disproportionate
29 share hospital match must be deposited in the General Fund as undedicated revenue.

30 **Sec. AAA-6. Department of Health and Human Services; state**
31 **psychiatric centers; transfers and adjustments to position count.** The
32 Commissioner of Health and Human Services shall review the current organizational
33 structure of the State's psychiatric centers to improve organizational efficiency and cost-
34 effectiveness within the centers. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State
35 Budget Officer is authorized to transfer position counts and available balances by
36 financial order in order to achieve the purposes of this section. In accordance with the
37 requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, a financial order
38 describing such a transfer must be submitted by the Department of Administrative and
39 Financial Services, Bureau of the Budget to the Office of Fiscal and Program Review 30
40 days before a transfer is to be implemented. In the case of extraordinary emergency
41 transfers, the 30-day prior submission requirement may be waived by vote of the joint
42 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and
43 financial affairs. Any transfer or adjustment pursuant to this section that would result in a
44 program or mission change must be reported to the joint standing committee of the

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1 Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters for review before
2 the associated financial order is submitted to the Governor for approval. These transfers
3 are considered adjustments to authorized position count, appropriations and allocations.'

4 Amend the amendment by inserting after Part GGG the following:

5 **'PART HHH**


