17 There is created a fund known as the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund, referred 18 to in this section as "the "fund." The fund must be deposited with and maintained by the 19 authority to be used solely for investment in the Maine potato industry. The fund must be 20 administered by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry in 21 accordance with Title 7, chapter 103, subchapter 10 Maine Potato Board, established in 22 Title 36, section 4603 and referred to in this section as "the board," and the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund Committee, established in Title 5, section 12004-H, 23 All money received by the authority from any source for the 24 subsection 10-A. 25 development and implementation of improved storage, packing and marketing and programs and activities that improve the economic viability of the potato industry must 26 be credited to the fund. At the discretion of the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, the authority shall make payments directly to the board, which shall use those 36 37 payments to implement the requirements of this section. During any period that the 38 commissioner has authorized direct payments from the authority to the board, the 39 authority shall make written annual reports to the commissioner and the joint standing 40 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and 41 forestry matters detailing the amounts of payments to the board and the dates payments 42 were made and detailing the expenditure of those payments. Repayment of these the 43 loans and interest on the loans must be credited to the fund to be available for making 44 additional state loans for the same purposes, except that any interest earned on the cash

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balance of the fund may be used for the grants authorized by Title 7, section 975-A. In order to provide additional amounts for loans, the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry commissioner, at the commissioner's discretion upon consultation with the board, may take such actions and enter into such agreements as may be necessary to sell or assign up to \$2,000,000 in the aggregate principal amount of loans and undivided interests in a pool of loans and assign or pledge any mortgage or other security to the authority, under the terms and conditions the commissioner considers advisable upon consultation with the board. The assignment and related transactions may not result in indebtedness of the State. The proceeds of the sale or assignment must be credited to the fund and used for the purposes authorized in this section.

SUMMARY

32 This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. The amendment, like the bill, changes 33 the governing authority of the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund from the Department 34 of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to the Maine Potato Board. The bill requires 35 the board to establish the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund Committee to advise the 36 board. The amendment instead establishes the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund 37 Committee in statute and changes the membership of the committee. The amendment 38 authorizes the Finance Authority of Maine, at the discretion of the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, to make payments to the board from the fund to 39 40 carry out the purposes of the fund. The amendment also requires the authority to provide 41 written annual reports to the commissioner and the joint standing committee of the

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1Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters2regarding the payments.3The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.4FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED5(See attached)

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation transfers governance of the Potato Marketing Improvement Fund from the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to the Maine Potato Board. As a result, the bill includes a deallocation of \$165,491 in fiscal year 2013-14 and \$168,103 in fiscal year 2014-15 to the department related to Personal Services and All Other costs for one Potato Storage Consultant position. Since the bill transfers this position's responsibilities but not the actual position to the Maine Potato Board, this analysis assumes the position would be eliminated. Additionally, the department receives reimbursement from the Finance Authority of Maine for the costs of this position. This revenue, \$165,491 in fiscal year 2013-14 and \$168,103 in fiscal year 2014-15, would be eliminated in the bill.

Additional costs to the Finance Authority of Maine can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
